Dear Parents

Year 3 Trip to Murton Park – 3 July 2017

On Monday 3 July, Year 3 will be visiting Murton Park near York for a trip back in history to learn about the Vikings times.

We will be visiting Danelaw which is a large outdoor classroom cunningly disguised as a Viking Village. The children will spend the day as Viking settlers. This will involve dressing in simple period costumes which will be provided. They will be taken to their new homes in the village and spend the day living as a Viking family, learning different skills and the dangers of their daily life.

We will be leaving School at 8.30am prompt travelling by the School's minibuses and returning to School at approximately 4.45pm. The children will have a Viking packed lunch provided and a bottle of water. Mr Haywood will lead the trip and will be accompanied by Mrs Reeves & Miss Thompson

The children should wear their trainers, PE tracksuit and polo shirt as the costumes will be worn on top of their own clothes. The School coat should also be brought and sun cream of the 'once a day' type should be applied before School. In addition the children may bring a bottle of water and they may bring a small camera, but they would have to be responsible for it. They may bring a maximum of £5 to spend in the gift shop. Money should be handed to the class teacher on the morning in a named purse or a sealed envelope with the child's name and amount on the front.

The cost of trip will be £17 which will be added to your account.

The trip will be subject to the conditions set out in the Parent Contract and will be covered by the school's insurance policy. Staff will take a first aid kit with them and there are additional first aid facilities on site. If your child suffers from asthma or severe allergic reactions please ensure their inhaler/medication/epipen is with them. If they do not have them, they will be unable to go on the trip. Please ensure that you have notified School of any changes to your contact numbers.
