



I would like to inform you of the changes that your child will encounter so that you can help prepare and support them for the year ahead.

Curriculum

Your child will be mostly class-based and they will be taught by an experienced member of our primary-trained staff. In addition to this, they will continue to receive some specialist teaching, for example in Music and PE. Your child will receive a copy of their new timetable in September and you will receive a termly newsletter which will identify the key aspects of curriculum coverage in Year 4.

Structure of the Day

Your child will have a longer teaching day, as the day for our Year 4 pupils will now finish at 3.55pm. At this time, your child will be dismissed from their lessons and will wait to be collected outside of the vicarage building. It is worth noting that your child will have PE every Monday and Thursday. Swimming will usually take place on a Friday but, until swimming resumes, they will receive an additional PE lesson during this time. They will need to wear their PE kit on these days (please see the letter from Miss Sweeney regarding PE & Games lessons, uniform and kit).

Equipment

Book bags are allowed in school. In order to ensure that your child is fully prepared for their day ahead, they will also need to be equipped with the following stationery items:

- pencils (HB) and sharpener; eraser; blue roller ball pen (no biro please) and spares – rub out pens, e.g. Frixion erasable rollerball with additional cartridges are preferable.
- a ruler
- a purple pen
- a protractor
- a pair of small scissors
- a glue stick
- coloured pencils (no felt tips please)
- highlighters (optional)

Other Requirements

- a water bottle which can be refilled throughout the day
- a healthy snack for morning break (in a disposable bag)
- a reading book either brought from home or taken out from the school library
- indoor & outdoor trainers
- an art overall

Homework

Your child will normally be set two pieces of core subject work per week (Maths and English) to consolidate the week's learning. They may also be asked to complete occasional topic work, e.g. Science, History, etc. The purpose of the homework is to support your child's learning. Each piece of homework should take approximately 20-30 minutes. In addition to this, the pupils will be given a set of spellings each week to learn for the following week and we would encourage your child to read every night for 10 minutes. Regular times tables practice is also advised. Please ensure that you read and sign your child's planner daily and check that any homework set has been completed. The planner is also a good way to communicate messages to your child's teacher. If your child is having difficulty completing the work in the required time, it is a good idea to write a note in their planner informing the child's tutor, or the particular subject teacher, so that the issue can be addressed quickly.
